
## SUMMARY

The Tarrant County COVID-19 Recovery Report provides relevant programmatic data and information on COVID-related programs currently administered by the County including the **COVID-19 Vaccination Program, COVID-19 Testing Program,** and the **Tarrant County Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)**. Additional programmatic information will be provided as new programs are implemented. Information related to grant funding applications and awards is also provided herein. The Tarrant County COVID-19 Recovery Report is provided to the Commissioners Court and the public every Tuesday.

### TARRANT COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH (TCPH) COVID-19 VACCINATION PROGRAM

In the section below, you will find tables and graphs to illustrate Tarrant County vaccination trends; however, please note that some of the data below displays doses *directly* administered by TCPH and does not reflect the total number of vaccinations administered by contractual and clinical partners. 



Figure 2. First dose, second dose, and third dose COVID-19 vaccination trends as reported by Tarrant County Public Health (TCPH) operated sites over the preceding three-month period. Most recent data may not be complete due to a lag in reporting.
