#### **Summary**

The Tarrant County COVID-19 Recovery Report provides information on current and upcoming COVID-related programs administered by the County. #### **Call for Proposals: Community Programs**

Tarrant County requested proposals for projects from nonprofit, local government, and quasi-governmental agencies that respond to the focus areas and goals guiding the County's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Proposals were accepted in the following areas: Improve Public Health and Wellness; Revitalize the Economy; and Strengthen the Community. \*Note: The application window closed on Monday, May 16 at 5:00. 131 applications were received with a total request amount of \$208 million. The county's evaluation committee has begun the proposal review and scoring process.



### **Other Recovery Updates**

**Small Business** 

•Commissioners Court approved the proposed framework for the Small Business Workforce Recovery Grant Program on 06/14/2022. The target start date is 07/11/2022.

Childcare

•Staff is working with Child Care Associates to finalize a contract for the \$45 million program for childcare in Tarrant County.

Housing

•Staff continues to meet with various stakeholders to determine best uses of the \$32.5 million allocated for affordable and/or supportive housing in Tarrant County.

Innovative Emergency Management (IEM)

- •IEM continues to work with staff on Phase 3 of Tarrant County's ARPA-FRF Program. Current activities include: Support with Final Rule Requirements; Structuring Upcoming Small Business Program; Proposal Review; Compliance and Monitoring; and Public-Facing Reporting.
- •IEM is working to finalize the After Action Report for Tarrant County's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
