

following proceedings were had, to-wit:

February 7th, 1916, the County Board of Trustees met in the office of the County Superintendent at the Court House on the above date, all members were present. Superintendent⁶M. H. Moore, President, called the meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted.

The representives from Rosen Heights Independent School District appeared before the board in behalf of the application for for the addition of some territory from the White Settlement School District No. 37: The application was turned down in view of the ruling of the State Superintendent, that the Board of Education could not add territory to an independent school district.

The Trustees from district number seven appeared before the County Board, asking for rearrangment of the district boundary line between Common School District number seven and eight. A motion was carried that such changes be made as recommended in the petition, with a copy of the boundary lines to accompany a copy of these minutes. Field notes as follows:

Beginning at a point in the N. Line of Tarrant Co. due N. of the N. W. corner of the J. L. Whitman Sur. said point being the N. W. corner of district No. 7 as established by the County Board of Trustees Feb. 7, 1916.

A motion that the board adjurn until the first Monday in May was made seconded and carried.

March 27, 1916, the County Board of Trustees met in call session in th County Superintendent's Office, Sup't. M. H. Moore presiding, Jno. Naylor, Lester Fleming, W. R. Fitch and J. L. Sidebottom being present. The Board was called to order by the president.

A petition from Common School Districts Nos. 72, 73 and 75 for the consolidation of said Common School Districts was read before the board. A motion was made and carried, that the Said Common School Districts be consolidated, the vote for consolidation being unanimous.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded that the board adjourn.

The County Board of Trustees met in the Superintendent's Office on the above date at 2 P.M. W. E. Boswell and R. C. Cain were the newly elected members. It being ascertained that these gentlemen had taken their oath of office they were allowed to be seated as members.

The board reorganized by electing M. H. Moore as President and W. E. Boswell as Vice President.

It was moved and seconded that the annual meeting of the local trustees of the county school districts be held the sixth and seventh days of August end the motion was carried.

W.E. Boswell and R. C. Cainand J.W. Naylor were appointed a committee to arrange for the meeting.

There being nosfurther business the meeting adjourned.

On June 19, 1916, the County Board of Trustees met in a called session in the County Superintendent's Office, all the members thereof towit: M. H. Moore President, W. E. Boswell, R. C. Cain, W. E. Williams and J. W. Naylor members, being present.

The meeting was called for the purpose of deciding the location of the school building to be erected in the newly consolidated district No.98.

After some discussion as to the advisability of the County Board's Litting as a board of arbitrators, it was finally decided, with the consent of both sides of the question of location, to allow the action of the said board to be final.

After a motion to that effect a ballot was taken, the vote being four for the new site and one for the old site,

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

following proceedings were had, to-wit:

A motion to grant Common School District No. 44 the tenth grade provided that as many as four pupils in regular attendance in that desired the tenth grade work, was made and passed.

A motion was made and carried to reduce the curriculum of Common School District No. 7 to seven grades.

Upon a motion Common School District No. 8 was granted the eighth grade and also the ninth grade if the Sup't. deemed it practical.

On a petition from Mr. W.H. Chance that his property be transferred from Common School District No. 79 to Common School District No. 80, a motion was carried to permit the transfer if the Attorne General ruled that the tranfer could be made.

A motion was carried unanimously that steps be taken to acquire an Attendance Officer for Tarrant County and the Superintendent was instructed to publish the fact in one of the local paper for three consecutive weeks. By motion the Board recommended that Monday November 27, 1916, be the day on which to begin compulsory attendance in Tarrant County.

The Board then adjourned to meet November 6, 1916.

On August 28, 1916, the County Board of Trustees met in a called session in the County Superintendent's Office. J. W. Naylor, W. E. Williams and R. C. Cain, members thereof, being present, the meeting was called to order.B

By a motion made by Mr. Naylor and seconded by Mr. Williams, the curriculum of Common School District No. 67 was limited to seven grades.

The trustees of Common School District No. 44 and of Common School District No. 45 petitioned the Board to reestablish the curricula of their respective syhool which existed before the previous ruling of the Board. Both petitions were rejected.

The following petition was presented to the Board:

State of Texas, County of Tarrant.

To the Honorable County Board of Trustees, Tarrant County, Texas.

We, the undersigned citizens and voters of Tarrant County and resident freeholders therein, believing that it will be to the best interests of the Schools of said county under the Compulsory Attendance Law to have in and for the schools of the county an Attendance Officer, do hereby petition and pray that you appoint an Attendance Officer in accordance with the law governing the same, said officer to begin his labors as soon as appointment can be made.

Dated this the 5th day of August, 1916.

After accepting the petition, Mr. Geo. C. Callaway was placed in nomination for Attendance Officer of Tarrant County. There being no other nomination Mr. Callaway was appointed by a unanimous vote of the Board and was instructed to begin work Sept. 1, 1916.

On a motion by Mr. Naylor the First Book of English by Kern and Noble was selected as a supplementary book for the English in the Eighth Grade

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.

The minuted of the last meeting.were read and approved. It was moved, seconded and carried that the Sublet school be allowed to teach the ninth grade.

A motion was made upon the application of E. A. Wheeler and E. W. Bradshaw that the land belonging to the aforesaid gentlemen and lying in the D. Odom Survey be transferred to the Diamond Hill Independent School District. This motion was seconded and after considerable discussion carried. The discussion developed the fact that the transfer of said property was satisfactory to all parties concerned and could never be a source of trouble to either district. It was further discovered that the tax in the Diamond Hill District was considerably more than that in the Watauga District. The Board therefore consented to make the transfer with the understanding that it was a matter of universal consent.

A motion was carried authorizing the county Superintendent to transfer for all high school transfers for the year 1916-17 such an amount of money in addition to the state and county apportionment, from the local maintenance tax, as will make three dollars per month for the time the school lasts in the district from which the transfer is made. This is on condition that said transfer attends the school as a bona fide pupil for such time men tioned.

There being no further business the Board adjourned to meet again the first Monday in February, 1917.

Upon the application of Mr. W. H. Chance for the transfer of 98 A. of land in the G. Ray Survey from the Webb School District No. 79 to the Gertie School District No. 80, a motion was made and carried that the transfer of said land be made.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the Sublett School No. 76 be allowed to teach the tenth grade.

The Board then adjourned to meet again February 8, 1917.

On February 8, 1917 the County Board of Trustees met in the County Superintendent's Office in called session, M. H. Moore, J. W. Naylor and W. E. Boswell being present.

The Board suspended all other business to take an automobile trip throug the Lone Elm, Union, Dove, Sams and Shady Grove School Districts to inspect the territory therein preparatory to making some consolidations.

After their return to the Court House, a motion was duly made and carried that Dove District No. 7, Union District No. 11, Whites Chapel District No. 12 and the East portion of of Sams District No. 6 be united into one school district known as Common School District No. 99. A motion was then made and carried that Mt. Gilead District No. 5, Lone Elm District No. 13 and the West portion of Sams District No. 6 be united into one school district known as Common School District No. 100. The County Superintendent was author ized to secure the services of the Gounty Surveyor to make the proper changes in the boundary lines to meet these new consolidations.

The Board then adjourned.

The County Board of Trustees met in call-session March 22, 1917, in the County Superintendent's Office, all the member thereof, towit; M. H. Moore, President, W. E. Boswell, J. W. Naylor, R. C. Cain and W. E. Williams, members, being present.

A proposition from a delegation from the Azle and Rock Hill Disricts was placed before the Board for consideration. The matter was postponed for further consideration at a meeting of representatives from the two districts at the Rock Hill Schoolhouse, March 31, 2 P.M.

The Board then adjourned.

The County ^Board of Trustees met in called session at the Court House on April 30, 1917, M. H. Moore, W. E. Boswell, W. E. Williams, R. C. Cain and J. W. Naylor being present.

A motion was made and seconded and unanimously carried to consolidate Common School District No. 1 and Common School District No. 88 into one district known as Common School District No. 101. M. W. Peden, W. B. Reed and V. E. Admire were appointed trustees of the new District.

A petition was read adn filed from the citizens of the Shady Grove District opposing a proposed change of territory from Lone Elm to Shady Grove A remonstance was presented to the Board by the citizens of the Mt. Gilead District, led by Mr. Neace, asking the Board to reconsider the con-solidation in district No. 100. After several talks and some discussion, the Board refused to reconsider the consolidation.

After receiving the request, the Board passed a motion to change the boundary line between district No. 99 and district No.100 so as to include the T Beedy, J. B. Martin, T. W. Mann, N. P. Martin, W. part of R. B. Price, S. part of D. Doght. #448 and the Mills surveys in district No. 100. A motion to cut off the Denton County portion of district No. 99, was seconded and carried.

Wednesday of the Teacher's County Institute Week was designated as the day for the meeting of the trustees of the county. The Board then voted to adjourn.

There came up to be considered a matter of transfer of territory from Tarrant County to Johnson County. The territory under consideration was a part of Common School District No. 61, Tarrant County. It developed that the County Board of Trustees of Johnson County had passed a motion to annex the territory to a school district of Johnson County. It was moved and carried that the territory in question be retained by Tarrant County.

By motion the school in District No. 45 was made a school of 7 grades. Upon the request by Mr. Hoaldridge the school in District No. 67 was allowed the eighth grade at the discretion of the County Superintendent.

A motion was carried that each high school transfer be allowed three dollars per month, including the state and county apportionment, for the length of time his home school lasts, provided he is in actual attendance at the school to which he transfers.

The Board then voted to adjourn.

The County Board of Trustees met in the County Superintendents Office on the 18th day of August in called session. The following members towit: M. H. Moore, President, R. C. Cain, W. E. Williams J. W. Naylor and W. E. Boswell, members, were present.

There came up to be considered the matter of the election of an attendance officer for 1917-18. A motion by Mr. Boswell that one be elected was carried three to one. P. M. Hall and Guy Reeves were placed in nomina-tion. A ballot being taken, the vote stood P. M. Hall, four and Guy Reevs, one. It was then moved ans carried that the term of the Attendance Officer for 1917-18 should last nine months and be terminated sooner if the Board should deem it necessary.

November 12th was suggested as the date for the compulsory attendance period to begin in the districts of the county.

The Board then adjourned to meet again November 5, 1917.

The Board passed an order making the apportionment of the County Available fund five cents per capita for the school year 1918-19. On the reccommendation of Mr. Timms, George Cardwell was appointed trustee of Mount Donwell school to serve until his successor was duly elected and qualified.

The Board passed an order instructing County Supt. Carroll to issue a check for \$2362.05 to the FortWorth Independent School Dist the amount due them as their apportionment of the County Available fund for the year 1917-18.

There being no other business the Board adjourned to meet at the next regular session or at the call of the chairman.

CHAIRMAN SELECTED:

By a motion made by V. A. Davis, Tarrant County, and seconded by Dr. J. L. Gammill, Tarrant County, Superintendent Proffer of Denton County presided at the open meeting of the two boards and trustees and patrons of the different schools.

MR. WILLIAMS' EXPLANATION:

Mr. W. E. MR. HEATH VIBITED DISTRICT:

Mr. Lark Heath, Denton County board member, stated that he had ridden over all the district involved and that the people out there stated that it was more convenient to attend the Roanoke School and he also stated he believed the State wanted them to go where it is more convenient and nearer.

FLORENCE TRUSTEE WANTS CHILDREN TAUGHT AT HOME:

Mr. Sheehey, trustee from Florence, stated that since the grade pupils were in Florence District he could not see why they are not permitted to teach them.

STATE LAW READ:

The chairman was requested to read the State law on transportation. He read some excerpts from the law that particularly applied to the case at hand.

HIGH SCHOOL AND GRADE CHILDREN CARED FOR:

Mr. Price, trustee from Keller, made some explanation of how Keller School District is involved in that they had purchased a bus to take care of the Florence District, taking the high school students to Keller and delivering the grade children at their own school at Florence.

HISTORY OF ROANOKE TRANSPORTATION:

Mr. Elmer Atkins, Superintendent of Roanoke School, stated that three years ago they were teaching 18 Florence children and transporting them. At that time he asked Mr. Williams and Mr. Walker, members of the Tarrant County Board, to come out and ride the district over and that Mr. Williams told him that the transfers for those children would be taken care of all right. Then they transferred the ones who asked for transfers last year. The people askd again this year for transfers and were refused. He also stated that he did not think bus lines should stand between children and their education but if the county board says to take the bus off he would do so.

TRANSFERS AND TRANSPORTATION MADE ANNUALLY:

Mr. Williams made the explanation that when Mr. Atkins came to see him he felt that under the conditions at that time if there were no chances for the children to go elsewhere it would be perfectly all right for them to go to Roanoke. The County Board understands transfers and transportation must be made separately for each year. When we came to consider these transfers the Florence people came to the Board and protested them because they wanted the grade children at home to maintain the Florence School.
