



They seek medical help through emergency room visits for injuries that are anything but related to the true nature. These are the women who survive their perpetrators attacks. Did you also know that Tarrant and Dallas counties have the second highest murder rate in the state?² There has been a steady increase in the number of women killed in domestic violence murders in Texas by their husband, ex-husband, intimate partner, boyfriend or ex-boyfriend.²

Domestic violence affects all socioeconomic statuses. It is an epidemic that a majority have either experienced first hand or have heard about. Become aware of the signs of possible abuse and do your civic duty to ensure that the victims feel safe in seeking help.
