

POOL SAFETY: What you need to know to keep you and your family safe!

The American Red Cross and National Swimming Pool Foundation have partnered to create educational resources on pool safety. Please take the time to visit the American Red Cross webpage and watch their online Home Pool Essentials course.

Tragically, over 200 young children drown in swimming pools, not including lakes, each year. Here are a few tips to keep in mind next time you are near water:

- 1. Secure pools with appropriate barriers.
- 2. Keep children under active supervision at ALL times.
- 3. Provide inexperienced swimmers with life jackets.

- 4. Keep pools clean and clear.
- 5. Establish and enforce rules and safe behaviors, such as "no diving".
- 6. Ensure everyone knows how to respond to aquatic emergencies. Become CPR certified.
- 7. Keep rescue equipment nearby.

Heat-related illnesses can happen to anyone—with infants and children at the greatest risk. In addition to staying hydrated and protecting our skin from the sun, we must also remember not to forget protection

from mosquitos/ticks. Here are some tips from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to keeping you and your family safe this summer:

- 1. Never leave infants, children, or pets in a parked car.
- 2. Dress infants and children in loose, lightweight, lightcolored clothing.
- 3. Schedule outdoor activities carefully, for morning and evening hours.

- 4. Stay cool with cool showers or baths.
- 5. Seek medical care immediately with symptoms of heat-related illness.
- 6. Cover up to protect against UV rays.
- 7. Use sunscreen with at least SPF 15 and UVA and UVB protection.
- 8. Use an effective insect repellent when outdoors.
- 9. Make your backyard a tick-safe zone.
- 10. Check yourself and your children for ticks.

MEET PATHFINDERS

A local nonprofit organization, Pathfinders' mission is to empower individuals and families to find their path from poverty to self-sufficiency. They do this by providing services that focus on mentoring and financial capability.

Pathfinders works through volunteer mentors with individuals and families struggling to overcome bonds of poverty, unemployment, homelessness and reentry after incarceration.



Services include:

- 1. Pre and post release mentoring
- Individual and group mentoring
- 3. Employment services
- 4. Family reunification through partner Parents and Partners of Prisoners
- 5. Pro-social activities
- 6. Post-release reentry court support
- 7. Family planning and women's health through partner UNTHSC
- 8. Financial education and coaching

TRINITY METRO: Serving Tarrant County by Bus and Rail

Trinity Metro, the public transportation agency for Fort level boarding, bike racks, USB ports, lap trays and Worth and Tarrant County, provides bus, trolley, paratransit and vanpool options as well as rail services, including the Trinity Railway Express (jointly owned and operated with DART). The agency has 43 bus routes and nearly 2,000 stops throughout the system. One of the most familiar routes is Molly the Trolley that circulates in downtown Fort Worth from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. every day.

One of the agency's biggest projects is TEXRail, a 27mile commuter rail line that will operate from Fort Worth to Dallas Fort Worth International Airport's Terminal B. With nine stations along the route, TEXRail will travel through North Fort Worth, North Richland Hills and Grapevine. Two of the stations are Trinity Metro's Texas & Pacific Station and the Intermodal Transportation Center, both of which are used by the TRE.

Featuring a sleek European design, the TEXRail trains will have a different look and feel than what is seen in this region. The FLIRT 3 (Fast Light Innovative Regional Train) model offers a roomy design for passenger comfort and a smooth ride. Each train will have a designated quiet car, extended platforms for

work tables.

Construction will be completed this fall and TEXRail will be ready for service by the end of the year. Two of the eight trains are already in Texas. After a VIP trip on New Year's Eve, TEXRail will begin full service in early January. With 72 train trips a day, TEXRail will be a great option for daily commuters, travelers and employees who would prefer to relax and enjoy their commute instead of being stuck in traffic.


