

Commissioner Roy Charles Brooks shared his own cancer survival story and how life can be lived to its fullest after prostate cancer. Commissioner Brooks stated. "it is far better to suffer the indignity of a prostate exam for a moment than to die from prostate cancer. Having a PSA sooner rather than later saved my life and gave me options." He encouraged all men - especially men of color to get checked early and often as they are diag-

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program is a free income tax preparation program for low-to-moderate income individuals and or families. Volunteers work to assist clients with filing their yearly tax return but also help to ensure tax credits are reported such as the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Child Tax Credit.


