The above summary provides a high-level view of the safety net profiles for JPS, Parkland, Harris Health System, and University System within their respective counties of Tarrant, Dallas, Harris and Bexar. Data was obtained from the American Hospital Association (AHA) database. It should be noted that financial data is from each hospital's most recently reported year to the AHA and that the AHA database is continuously refreshed as hospitals provide updated information. In general, all four public hospitals listed above are providing slightly more or less than 50% of the total uncompensated care cost in their respective counties, and each is serving a far greater percentage of Medicaid patients than Medicare patients. Both sets of percentages, however, are impacted by the total number of reporting hospitals in the applicable county.
