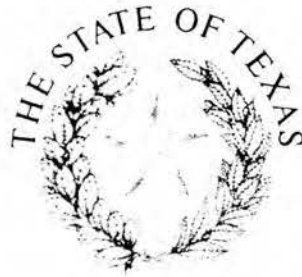

The William B. Monnig House, located at 312 Leuda, Fort Worth, Texas, has been described in the Historic Preservation Council of Tarrant County's historic resources survey as a "large Craftsman Style house" with "exaggerated stick-like roof brackets, post-and-beam west porch, .. an unusually ambitious example of a style rare in Fort Worth. With restoration the house could be eligible for the National Register."¹

I HISTORY OF THE LAND

The property on which the William B. Monnig House was built was in the original Peter T. Welch Survey in Tarrant County. The land was patented by E.F. Terrell on October 31, 1856, under patent number 639, Volume 13. It is Robertson 3rd class file number 2547. The field notes list it as being 125.5 acres. A December 23, 1881 warranty deed states that W.B. Tucker and his wife Mahala Ann Tucker were paid \$200 by H.W. Davis for land being in the southwest part of the 125 1/2 acre survey of Peter T. Welch on May 3, 1873. This was block 23, a 200 foot square parcel of land.² On April 22, 1884 W.S. Ikard sold block 23 in the Tucker Addition to E.B. Harrold. Harrold paid him \$5,000.³

M.M. Barnes bought the 23rd block of the Tucker Addition on January 9, 1888 from E.B. Harrold.⁴ M.M. Barnes, and his wife Josie Harrold Barnes, then sold the land to William Monnig. He paid \$7,000 cash and gave a note for \$2,500 at 8% due in one year for all of block 23 in the Tucker Addition. It was 200 feet square bounded by Ireland on the north, south by Leuda, west by Florence (now called May Street), and on the east by St. Louis Avenue. It was agreed that the south one-half of the block being conveyed would be absolutely free and clear of any lien. William Monnig was to be entitled to a release of lien on any tract 50 ft. x 100 feet out of the north one-half whenever he paid

M.M. Barnes, or the legal holder of the note as much as \$1,500 of the purchase price of the promissory note. The taxes for the year 1906 were prorated as follows - M.M. Barnes was to pay one fourth and William Monnig was to pay 3/4.⁵

Louis Weinman, well known Fort Worth architect, designed the house at 312 West Leuda for Monnig in 1905.⁶ The 1907 city directory of Fort Worth featured a picture of the Monnig house..

Mr. Monnig died in 1947 and was buried in Greenwood Cemetery.⁷

The house was sold August 20, 1952 to James J. Nation for \$10 and consideration.⁸

John W. Hyman and his wife Sarah bought the house for \$10 and consideration November 4, 1959.⁹

On June 15, 1983 John Special and David McMillan bought the property for \$10 and consideration.¹⁰

Rickey Joe Brantley and his wife Ellen M. of Grapevine, Texas bought the house at 312 West Leuda for their home on December 15, 1983 for \$10 and consideration.¹¹ The actual amount paid was \$18,000.¹² They have nearly completed an extensive campaign to restore the house to its original 1906 condition.

II DESCRIPTION OF THE HOUSE

The William Monnig house is a three story wood clapboard with a cross gabled roof of normal slopes. The side gable has pairs of windows that allows the attic area to be finished for a large bedroom. The unenclosed eaves have a moderate overhang. There are two brick chimneys.

There is a porch partially across the front and east side lower floor. The low pitched roof over the porch is supported by square brick columns that continue to the ground level. The balustrade is of an open pattern of brickwork.

There are two bay windows flanking each end of the porch. The front door has very decorative leaded glass with side windows. Just east of the door

is the big window in the living room that has similar leaded glass in its upper sash. The west side door has an extended porch with supportive wood posts and brackets.

Louis Weinman designed this high-style craftsman house for the William Monnig family. At that time in Fort Worth the architecture was unusual, the style originating in California. William Monnig's son, Oscar Monnig is in possession of the original house plans.

Upon entering the leaded glass front door, one is in a large living room. There is a walnut pilaster on each side of the room spanning crosswise to the right of the front door. The window facings are wide, shaped with broken pediments. The fireplace is shaded natural colored tile, often found in Victorian houses. It has an encased brass stove that uses gas. Above the mantle are clays with the imprint of embossed horses with riders. On either side of the fireplace are long matching sash windows. The brass light fixtures hanging on chains are original with the house. On the north of the living room are wide double French doors and on either side of them are brass sconces with crystals. To the west of the front door is a smaller set of French doors leading to the front parlor. It has three windows in the bay on the south.

The staircase has square newel posts and its flat spindles have a staggered open pattern of crosses. The stairs raise straight to the landing and are on the west side of the house leading in from the west entrance.

The dining room north of the living room has a bay of three large windows on the east side. The back stairs are off the pantry. The pantry has enclosed glass shelves. The kitchen is of a generous size at the northwest corner of the house.

The bedrooms are all of ample size and one has a fireplace that shares the chimney with the living room fireplace. The mantle is golden oak with Ionic columns supporting the beveled mirror above. The stove is coal and has the

original metal face. It is surrounded by narrow horizontal tiles.

The ballroom is on the third floor and has beaded walls and ceiling.

III MONNIG FAMILY HISTORY

William Monnig's family originated in Germany. His grandfather had been a physician to the German royal family and they put their faith in him above their doctors of long standing. His name was Malnnich. William's father, Otto, was born in Rees on the western German border in 1826. He came to the United States in 1844, settling near the Missouri River. He learned English and married Amelia Zetzer. When his parents died Otto inherited \$10,000 and changed his name from Malnnich to Monnig. Otto invested in St. Louis, Missouri property and started a hardware business. He was in the general mercantile business for fifteen years in St. Louis before moving to Hermann, Missouri, where he remained for twenty-five years. Hermann was a town of 1,500, located eighty miles west of St. Louis. William Monnig was born there in 1866. His father Otto, had four sons and five daughters.

William had planned to move to Omaha, but his father said that Texas was warmer. He visited several leading Texas cities looking for new opportunities. A Dallas real estate agent focused William's attention on Fort Worth by criticizing the city of 18,000 as overestimated.¹³

William Monnig paid \$500 down on two lots at 1304-1306 Main Street and wrote his father of the deal. The family then moved to Fort Worth. William, age 22, George, 19, and Otto, the eldest son, opened the Monnig store on April 2, 1889. The Monnig store had a 50-foot frontage, two stories in height, designed by Haggart and Sanguinet. William and George had the dry goods in their 25 foot section and Otto had a hardware department in his 25 foot section. The space was separated by a brick wall which they later knocked out.¹⁴ Their father died in Hermann in 1907. After William and George opened Monnigs they lived on the second floor of the building the first few years.¹⁵

From an investment of \$2,500 the Monnigs built a business second to none from \$44.00, the first day's receipts, to \$5,000 per day in 1912.¹⁶

It was William Monnig who introduced penny change in Fort Worth and for this he got the newest pennies. William was the President and Treasurer and George was Vice-President and Secretary of Monnigs Department Store. This was the first department store in Fort Worth.

In 1911 William and George bought 172 acres of land near the Southwest Baptist Theological Seminary. They paid \$1,400 for the property to develop as a farm. William Monnig was founder and president of Mutual Home Savings Association, President of Bankers and Citizens Life Insurance Co., Director of the Chamber of Commerce, President of Jobbers and Manufactures League, and a stockholder in the Mercantile Club. The Monnig brothers were leaders and contributed liberally financially to worthy causes. In 1936 William Monnig helped to underwrite the cost of Casa Manana.¹⁷

Captain B.B. Paddock, local newspaper publisher, wrote that William Monnig came to Fort Worth in 1889 with his brothers Otto E. and George B. William became executive head of the wholesale and retail operations, doing an annual business of \$6,000,000 with an average force of 250 employees in 1922.

He was a director of Farmers and Mechanic National Bank, President of Mutual Home Association, Director of W.B. Fishbaum Company, President of the Citizens Hotel Company, and President of the Chamber of Commerce of 1920. He was a member of the Fort Worth Club, River Crest Country Club, Glen Garden Country Club, Rotary Club, and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. He married Miss Alma Wandry in 1891 and had three sons, Otto, William, Jr., and Oscar.¹⁸

Fort Worth city directories in 1905-1906 document that William and George B. Monnig were in wholesale and retail dry goods, carrying notions, clothing, boots shoes, hats, furnishing goods, millinery at 1302-1304 Main.¹⁹

The 1909-1910 directory identifies William Monnig as President and

Treasurer of Monnig Dry Goods Company, and President of Mutual Home Association; Monnig Dry Goods, 1304-1306-1308 Main; Residence, 312 W. Leuda.²⁰

William Monnig was a member of the Fort Worth City Council in 1925 and 1929-1935. He investigated city welfare handling in 1932. He always favored local contractors if bids were not greater than 5% of the outside bidders.²¹

William Monnig died in 1947 and is buried in Greenwood Cemetery.²²

In 1979, on the Monnig Store's ninetieth anniversary, Oscar Monnig opened their sixth store, Monnigs Park Row in Arlington, Texas, following others in the malls of Tarrant County.²³

Desiring to retire, Oscar in 1980 sold Monnigs wholesale inventory to William R. Moore, Inc. of Memphis.²⁴

4/10/86 According to Jan Viles, executive director of the Bridge Association, which is the new owner of the Monnig Home, restoration is complete and the house will be used as the social service agency's administrative offices and an emergency shelter for homeless youth.

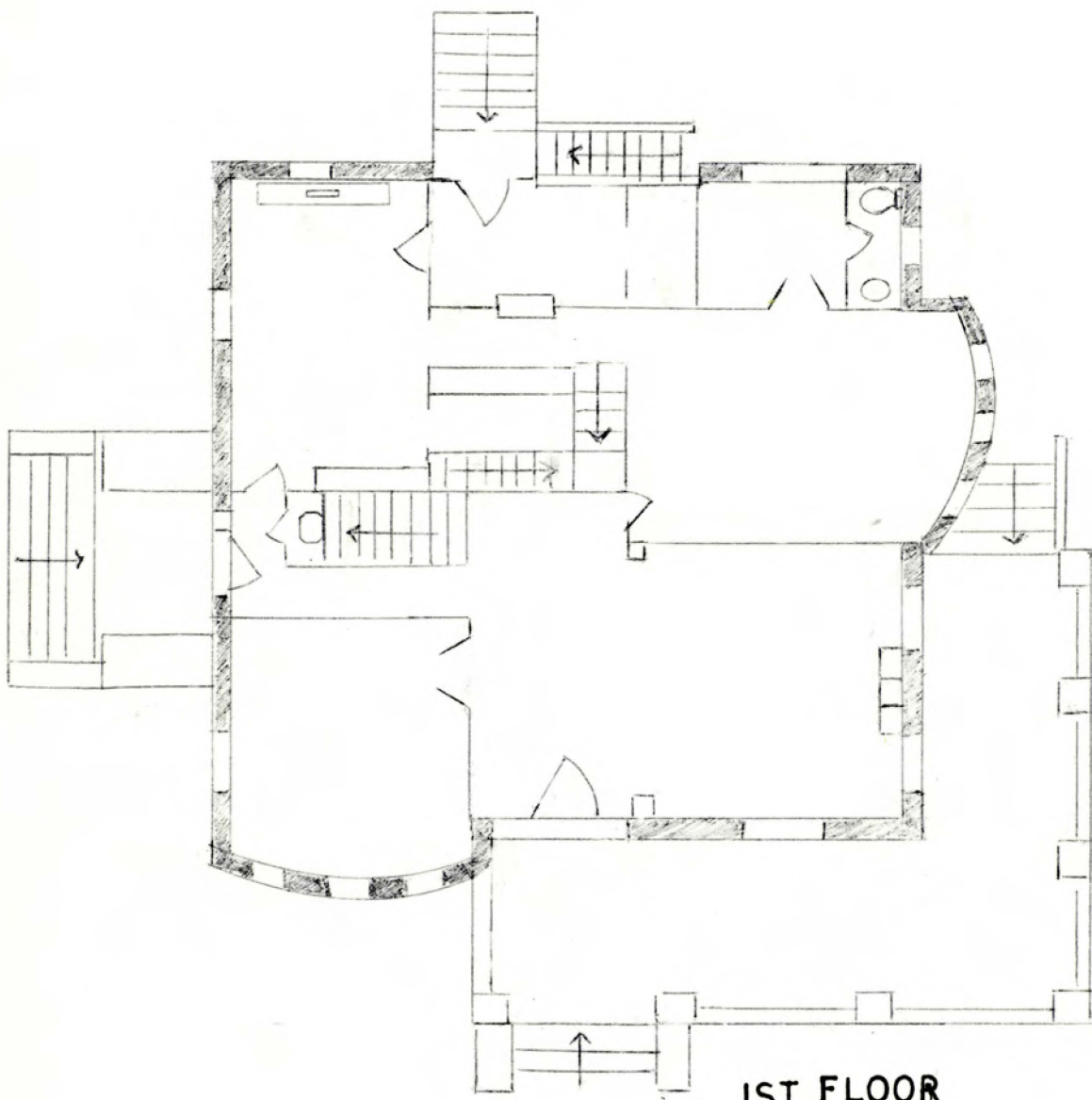

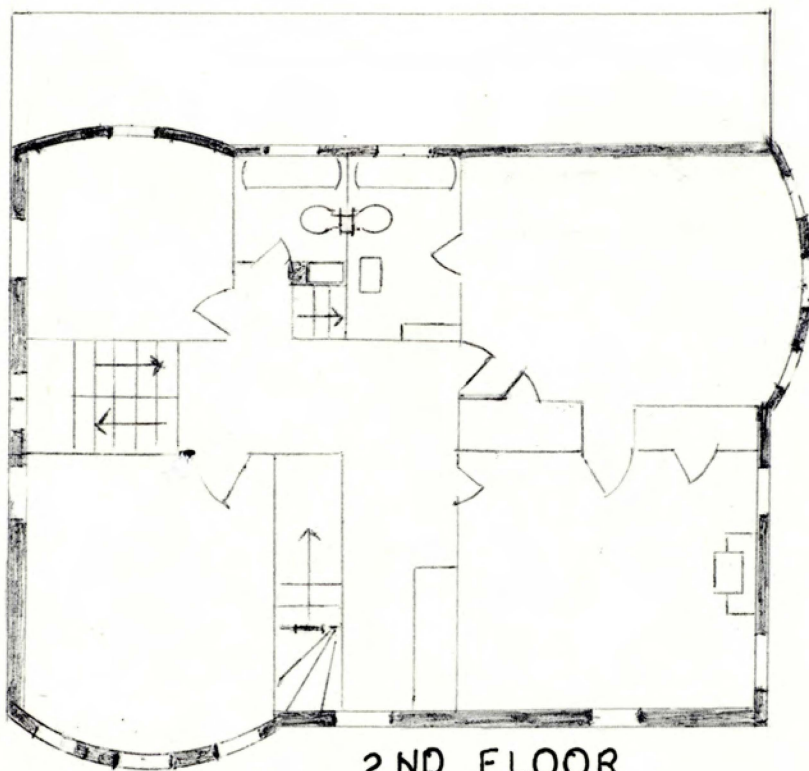

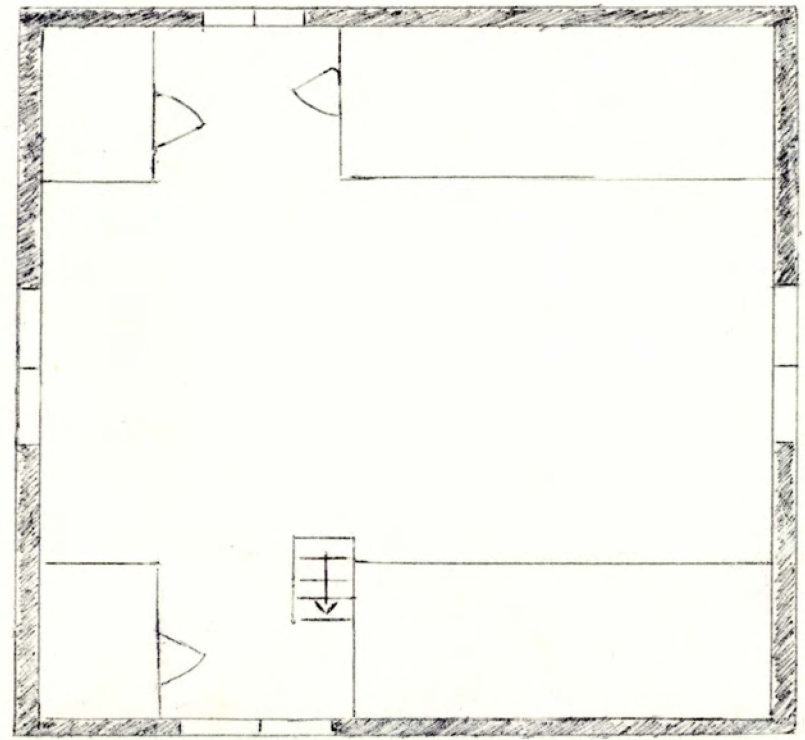

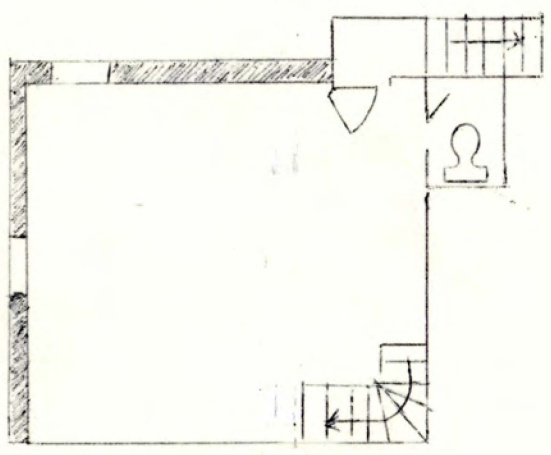

62. 311 W Leuda Street Roseland Apartments c. 1924
JLCD

Located in an older prestigious residential neighborhood, this two-story brick apartment building fits gracefully onto its site. It was built around 1924 for Mrs. Irene G. Barrow, and known as the Roseland Apartments in the late 1920's and 1930's. The building has particularly fine casement windows with delicate mullions.

63. 312 W Leuda Street William B. Monnig House 1905
NR*/JLCD

This large Craftsman Style house was built in 1905 for William B. Monnig, founder of the Monnig's Department Store chain. The Monnig family owned the house until 1952. The exaggerated stick-like roof brackets,

post-and-beam west porch, and ~~extensive wood wainscoting~~ in the interior make the house an unusually ambitious example of a style rare in Fort Worth. With restoration the house could be eligible for the National Register.

64. 401 W Leuda Street Graham House 1910
NR/JLCD

A two-story brick house, rectangular in plan, with flaring hip roof and full porch supported by stout brick piers. The roof retains original copper cresting. A two-story brick garage at the rear has arched openings with green terra cotta keystones; it was converted to a store c. 1920. The house and garage are substantially built and situated on a prominent corner site. Constructed in 1910 by brick contractor William M. Graham, the house served as his own residence until 1919. Graham was a partner in the Innis-Graham Construction Co., a major building firm in Fort Worth, contractors for nearby Hogg School in 1909 and the old Fort Worth High School in 1910-11 (see N102 and N55 respectively). The house appears to be eligible for the National Register for its architectural quality and for its association with a major builder.

65. 409 W Leuda Street Bryan House c. 1901
NR*/JLCD

A one and one-half story wood-frame house clad in channel rustic siding. The house is quaintly composed and miniature in scale. A hipped dependency projects forward, supported by Tuscan columns framing a recessed porch. This is balanced by a gabled bay with bracketed eave returns and shingled pediment. A tiny double-gabled dormer is set high on the house's hip roof. The house was built around 1901 for Morgan Bryan, a socially prominent attorney. His wife was Helen Daggett, member of the pioneer Fort Worth family. The house may be eligible for the National Register following documentation of its architect or builder.

66. 201 Lipscomb Street National Biscuit Co. c. 1921
Ind(NR) Warehouse

A small, one-story rectangular brick warehouse, with central garage entry. Ornamentation is simple, including brick string course and curved parapet. Built around 1921, the structure was first occupied by the

The William B. Monnig House, located at 312 Leuda, Fort Worth, Texas, has been described in the Historic Preservation Council of Tarrant County's historic ~~resources survey~~ resources survey as a "large Craftsman Style house" with "exaggerated stick-like roof ~~brackets, post-and-beam west porch,~~ brackets, post-and-beam west porch, .. an unusually ambitious example of a style rare ~~in Fort~~ in Fort Worth. With restoration the house could be eligible for the National Register."¹

I HISTORY OF THE LAND

The property ~~was in the~~ on which the William B. Monnig House was built was in the original Peter T. Welch Survey in Tarrant County. The land was patented by

A December 23, 1881 warranty deed states that W. B. Tucker and his wife Mahala Ann Tucker were paid \$200 by H. W. Davis for land being in the southwest part of the 125 1/2 acre survey of Peter T. Welch on May 3, 1873. This was block 23, a 200 foot square parcel of land. 3

On April 22, 1884 W. S. Jkard sold block 23 in the Tucker Addition to E. B. Harrold. Harrold paid him \$5,000. 3

M. M. Barnes bought the 23rd block of the Tucker Addition on January 9, 1888 from E. B. Harrold. Description: Beginning 395 ft. north and 300 ft. east from the southwest corner of the 125 1/2 acres of the Peter Welch Survey in the Tucker Addition is laid out thence north 20 ft., thence east 200 ft., thence south 20 ft., thence west 200 ft. to the place of beginning. 4 5

M. M. Barnes, and his wife Josie Harrold Barnes, then sold the land to William Monnig. He paid \$7,000 cash and gave a note for \$2,500 at 8% due in one year for all of block 23 in the Tucker Addition. It was 200 feet square bounded by Ireland on the north, south by Leuda, west by Florence and now called May Street, and on the east by St. Louis Avenue. 4

It was agreed that the south one-half of the block being conveyed ^{would be} absolutely free and clear of any lien. William Monnig was to be entitled to a release of lien on any tract 50 ft X 100 feet out of the north one-half

whenever he paid M. M. Barnes, or the legal holder of the note as much as \$1,500 of ~~said~~ ^{the} purchase price of the promissory note.)

The taxes for the year 1906 were prorated as follows - M. M. Barnes was to pay one fourth and William Monnig was to pay 3/4. ⁵

Louis Weirman, well known Fort Worth architect, designed the house at 312 West Leuda. ~~for~~ ^{for Monnig in 1905.} The 1907 city directory of Fort Worth ~~has~~ ^{featured} a picture of the Monnig house.

Mr. Monnig died in 1947 and was buried in Greenwood Cemetery. ⁷

The house was sold August 20, 1952 to James J. Nation for \$10 and consideration. ⁸

John W. Hyman and his wife Sarah bought the house for \$10 and consideration November 4, 1959. ⁹

On June 15, 1983 John Special and David McMillan bought the property for \$10 and consideration. ¹⁰

Rickey Joe Brantley and his wife Ellen M. of Grapevine, Texas bought the house at 312 West Leuda for their home ^{on} December 15, 1983 for \$10 and consideration. ¹¹ The actual amount paid was \$18,000. ¹² They have nearly completed an extensive campaign to restore the house to its original 1906 condition.

II DESCRIPTION OF THE HOUSE

The William Monnig house is a three story wood clapboard with a cross gabled roof of normal slopes. The side gable has pairs of windows that allows the attic area to be finished for a large bedroom. The unenclosed eaves have a moderate overhang. There are two brick chimneys.

There is a porch partially across the front and east side lower floor. The low pitched roof over the porch is supported by square brick columns that continue to the ground level. The balustrade is of an open pattern of brickwork.

There are two ~~story~~ bay windows flanking each end of the porch.)

The front door has very decorative leaded glass with side windows. Just

east of the door is the big window in the living room that has similar leaded glass in its upper sash.

The west side door has an extended porch with supportive wood posts and brackets.

Louis Weinman designed this high-style craftsman house for the William Monnig family. At that time in Fort Worth ~~it~~ ^{the architecture} was unusual, the style originating in California. (William Monnig's son,)

Oscar Monnig is in possession of the original house plans.

Upon entering the leaded glass front door, one is in a large living room. There is a walnut pilaster on each side of the room spanning crosswise to the right of the front door. The window facings are wide, shaped with broken pediments.

The fireplace is shaded natural colored tile, ^{often} found in Victorian houses. It has an encased brass stove that uses gas. Above the mantle are clays with the imprint of embossed horses with riders. On either side of the fireplace are long matching sash windows.)

The brass light fixtures hanging on chains are original with the house.)

On the north of the living room are wide double French doors and on either side of them are brass sconces with crystals.)

To the west of the front door is a smaller set of French doors leading to the front ^{parlor} ~~parlor~~. It has three windows in the bay on the south ~~side~~.

The staircase has square newel posts and its flat-spindles have a staggered open pattern of ~~a~~ crosses. The stairs raise straight to the landing and are on the west side of the house leading in from the west entrance.

The dining room north of the living room has a bay of three large windows on the east side. The back stairs are off the pantry. The pantry has enclosed glass shelves. The kitchen is of a generous size at the northwest corner of the house.

The bedrooms are all of ample size and one has a fireplace that shares the chimney with the livingroom fireplace. The mantle is golden oak with Ionic columns supporting the beveled mirror above. The stove is coal and has the original metal face. It is surrounded by narrow horizontal tiles. The ballroom is on the third floor and has beaded walls and ceiling.

III Monnig Family History

William Monnig's family originated in Germany. His grandfather had been a physician to the German royal family and they put their faith in him above their doctors of long standing. His name was Malnrich. William's father,

~~his son~~ Otto, was born in Rees on the western German border in 1826. He came to the United States in 1844, settling near the Missouri River. He learned English and married Amelia Zetzer. When his parents died ~~he~~ ^{Otto} inherited \$10,000 and changed his name from Malnrich to Monnig. Otto

→ ~~He~~ invested in St. Louis, Missouri property and started a hardware business. He was in the general mercantile business for fifteen years in St. Louis before moving to Hermann, Missouri, where he remained for twenty-five years. Hermann was a town of 1,500, ^{located} eighty miles west of St. Louis.)

→ William Monnig was born ^{then} in 1856, in ~~Hermann~~. His father Otto, had four sons and five daughters.

William had planned to move to Omaha, but his father said that Texas was warmer. He visited several leading Texas cities looking for new opportunities. A Dallas real estate agent focused William's attention on Fort Worth by ~~said~~ ^{criticizing} ~~nothing~~ the city of 18,000 as overestimated. ¹³

William Monnig
He paid \$500 down on two lots at 1304-1306 Main Street and wrote his father of the deal. The family then moved to Fort Worth. William, ^{age} ~~was~~ 22, George, 19, and Otto, the eldest son, opened the ^{Monnig} store ^{on} April 2, 1889.)

→ The Monnig store had a 50-foot frontage, two stories in height, designed by Haggart and Sanguinet. William and George had the dry goods in their 25 Foot ~~section~~ and Otto had ^{department} hardware in his 25 Foot ~~section~~. The space was separated by a brick wall which they later knocked out. ¹⁴

→ Their father died in Hermann in 1907. After William and George opened Monnigs ~~between 12 and 13 Streets~~ they lived on the second floor of the building the first few years. ¹⁵

From an investment of \$2,500 they ^{Monnig's} built a business second to none from

\$44⁰⁰ the first day's receipts, to \$5,000 per day in 1912. ¹⁶

It was William Monnig who introduced penny change in Fort Worth and for this he got the newest pennies. William was the President and Treasurer and George was Vice-President and Secretary of Monnig's Department Store. This was the first department store in Fort Worth. ^D

~~At~~ In 1911 William and George bought 172 acres of land near the Southwest Baptist Theological Seminary. They paid \$14,00 for the property to develop as a farm. ^S

William Monnig was founder and president of Mutual Home Savings Association, President of Bankers and Citizens Life Insurance Co., Director of the Chamber of Commerce, President of Jobbers and Manufacturers League, and a stockholder in the Mercantile Club. ^S

The Monnig brothers were leaders and contributed liberally financially to worthy causes.

In 1936 William Monnig helped to underwrite the cost of Casa Manana. ¹⁷

Captain B. B. Paddock, ^{local} ~~famous~~ newspaper ^{publisher,} wrote that William Monnig came to Fort Worth in 1889 with his brothers Otto E. and George B. William became executive head of the wholesale and retail ^{operations,} doing an annual business of \$6,000,000 ^{with} ~~and had~~ an average force of 250 employees in 1922.

He was a director of Farmers and Mechanic National Bank, President of Mutual Home Association, Director of W. B. Fishbaum ^{Company,} President of the Citizens Hotel ^{Company,} and President of the Chamber of Commerce in 1920. He was a member of the Fort Worth Club, River Crest Country Club, Glen Garden Country Club, Rotary Club, and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. ^S

He married Miss Alma Wandry in 1891 and had three sons, Otto, William, Jr., and Oscar W. ¹⁸

Fort Worth city directories in 1905 ¹⁹⁰⁶ document that ~~in 1895~~ William and George B. Monnig were in wholesale and retail dry goods, ^{carrying} notions, clothing, boots, shoes, hats, furnishing goods, millinery at 1302-1304 Main. ¹⁹ ~~"Grand Leader" 201-213 Houston,~~ ¹⁹

The 1909-1910 directory identifies⁻⁶⁻

William Monnig ~~was~~ ^{as} President and Treasurer of Monnig Dry Goods Company, and

President of Mutual Home Association; Monnig Dry Goods, 1304 - 1306 - 1308
Main, Residence, 312 W. Leuda. ²⁰ ~~Monnig Dry Goods was at 510 Houston.~~

William Monnig was a member of the Fort Worth City Council in 1925 and
1929 - 1935. He investigated city welfare handling in 1932. He always
favored local contractors if bids were not greater than 5% of the outside
bidders. ²¹

William Monnig died in 1947 and is buried in Greenwood Cemetery. ²²

In 1979, on the ^{Monnig} Store's ninetieth anniversary, Oscar ^{Monnig} ~~his son~~ opened their
sixth store, Monnigs Park Row in Arlington, Texas, followed ⁱⁿ others in the
malls of Tarrant County. ²³

Desiring to retire, in 1980, ^{Oscar} ~~poed~~ Monnigs wholesale inventory ~~was sold~~ to
William R. Moore, Inc. of Memphis. ²⁴

Roy L. Hiser went to work at thirteen years old as a stock boy for J. C.
Penny. It was on 4th Street between Houston and Throckmorton. In 1939
he went to work for William Monnig. Hiser, Vice-president and general man-
ager of the wholesale division, sold the store in 1980.

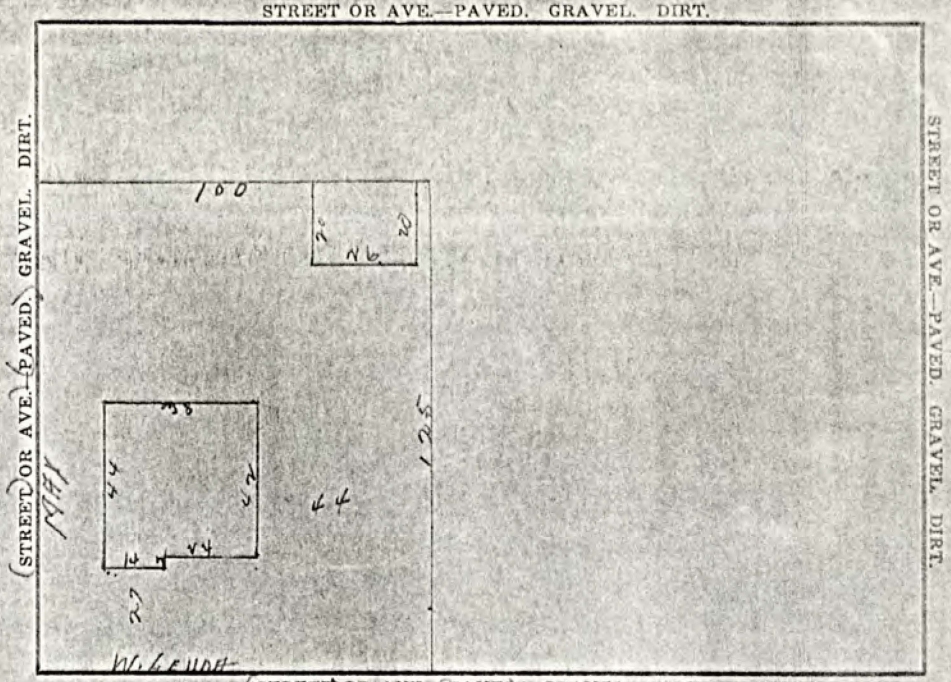

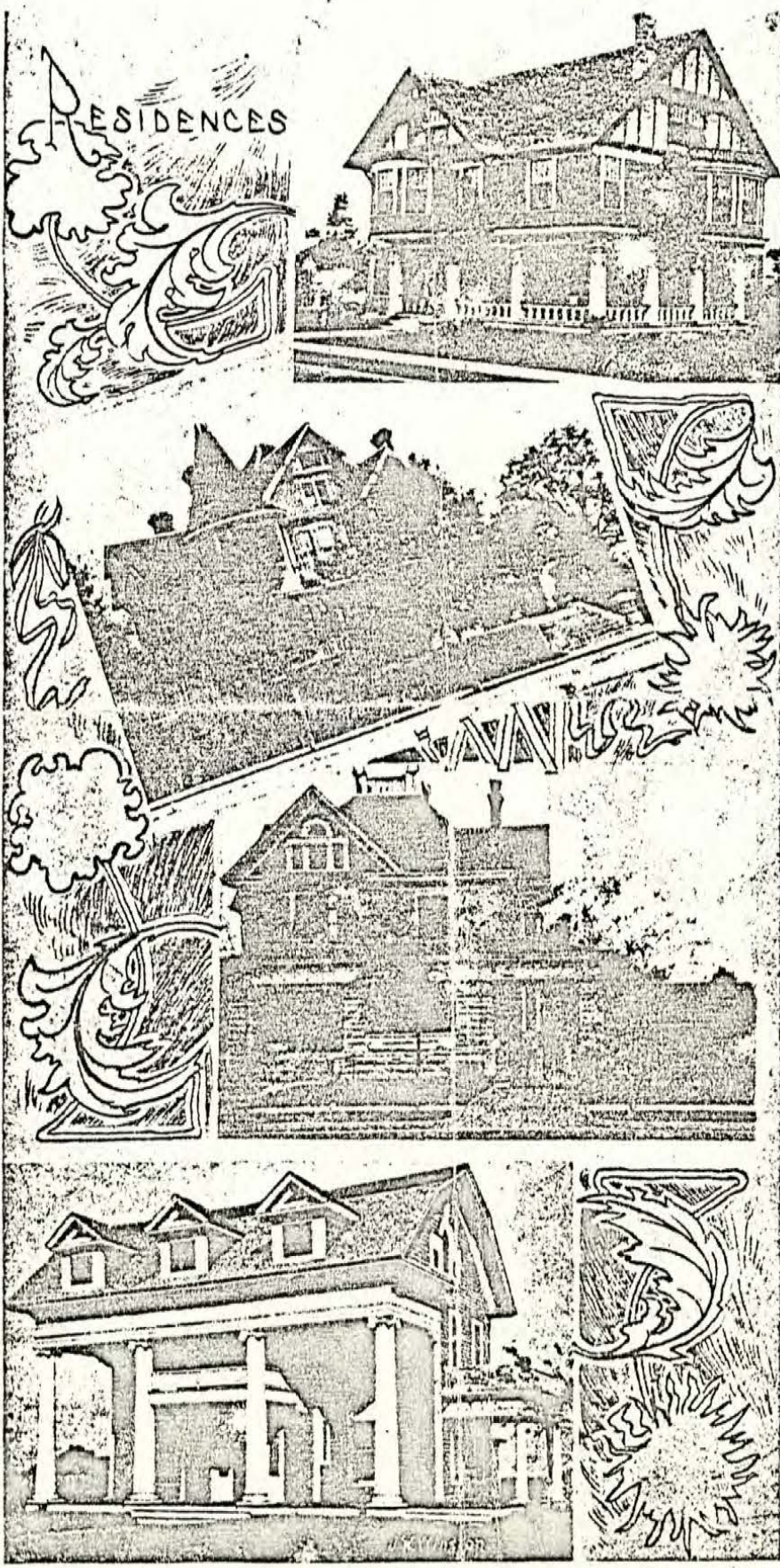

It is further ordered by the Court that Lacy Boggess, H.H. Morse and C. H. McBrayer be and they are hereby appointed appraisers to appraise the estate, both real and personal of Wm. Monnig, deceased.

I, Wm. Monnig, of the County of Tarrant and State of Texas, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others which I have heretofore made.

1. I direct that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate by my executors.

2. All of the property, both real and personal, owned by my wife, Alma Monnig, and by myself, is community property, and this will shall cover and dispose of only my undivided one half interest in such community.

3. I give, devise and bequeath unto my wife, Alma Monnig, my undivided one half community interest in the following property:

a. All bonds or other obligations of the United States government which we own; b. The residence which is our homestead, described as the South 125 feet of the west one-half of Block 23, Tucker Addition to the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, together with all the household furnishings and the family automobile.

4. I give, devise and bequeath my undivided one-half interest in all the remainder of the community estate, both real and personal, to the following:

Continued

a. An undivided one-third interest in my half of such community estate to my son, Ottow W. Monnig. b. An undivided one-third interest in my half of such community estate to my son, Oscar E. Monnig. c. An undivided one-sixth interest in my half of such community estate to my daughter-in-law, Edith Monnig. d. An undivided one-sixth interest in my half of such community estate to my grandson, Wm. Monnig III. Provided however, that such portions of the corporate stock of the Monnig Dry Goods Company as are inherited by Edith Monnig and by Wm. Monnig III shall be issued to Otto W. Monnig and Oscar E. Monnig as joint trustees for Edith Monnig and Wm. Monnig III, respectively.

5. Such trust shall continue for ten years after my death, except that it shall terminate in the event of the death of both the trustees or may be terminated by the trustees or the survivor of them at any earlier date as to either or both of said beneficiaries. In the event of the death of either of the trustees, the survivor may continue to act as sole trustee.

While the trust is in effect:

a. The trustees shall exercise all voting or other rights pertaining to such stock;

b. None of such stock shall be encumbered in any way or sold or transferred without the joint consent of the trustees and of Edith Monnig or Wm. Monnig, III, respectively; and

c. Any dividends paid on such stock shall be turned over to Edith Monnig or to Wm. Monnig, III, respectively, by the trustees as soon as received, except that any dividends in the form of stock of the Monnig Dry Goods Company shall continue to be issued to the trustees for the respective beneficiaries and handled as provided above.

At the termination of the trust such stock shall be re-issued directly to Edith Monnig and Wm. Monnig III, respectively, who shall thereafter be entitled to all voting and other rights pertaining thereto, the full power of control and disposition of such stock, and direct payment of all dividends thereon.

6. I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons, Otto W. Monnig and Oscar E. Monnig, executors of this my last will and testament, and direct that no bond be required of them as executors. In case of the death, failure, refusal or inability to act of either of such executors, the remaining executor shall have full power to act as such, so that if only one executor qualifies or if at any time in the course of the administration of my estate, only one of my said executors be duly qualified and acting, his sole action shall be valid and binding on my estate. Said executors shall have full power of management and control over my estate in every particular, and I authorize and empower them to rent, sell, exchange or dispose of any portion of my estate, real or personal, at public or private sale for any price on any terms and in any manner that may to them seem best, for the purpose of paying any of my debts. Any and all instruments of title, including bills of sale, deeds, leases, oil and gas leases and mineral deeds, signed by my executors as such, shall be fully binding to pass such interest or give such rights as may be therein expressed, without the necessity of the joinder of said executors individually or as trustees or the joinder of any other person, provided that there is a recitation in said instrument that it is executed for the purpose of securing money with which to pay my debts.

7. It is my will that no other action should be had in the county court in the administration of my estate than to prove and record this will and to return an inventory and appraisement of my estate and list of claims.

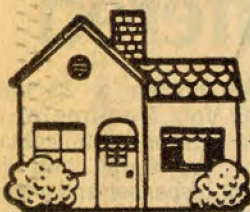

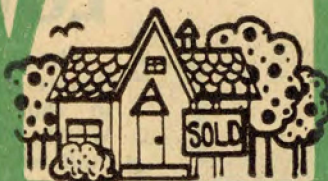

William Monnig home open for viewing today

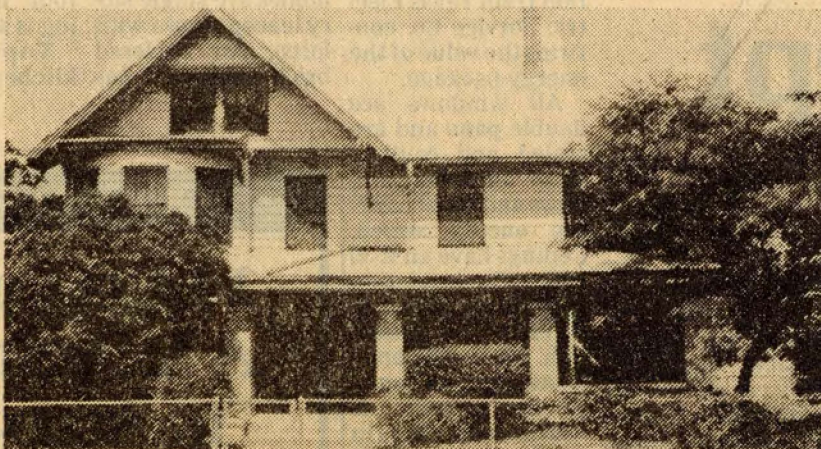
The William Monnig home, constructed in 1905, will be open for viewing from noon to 6 p.m. today. William Rigg will host the opening.

The second floor has four bed-



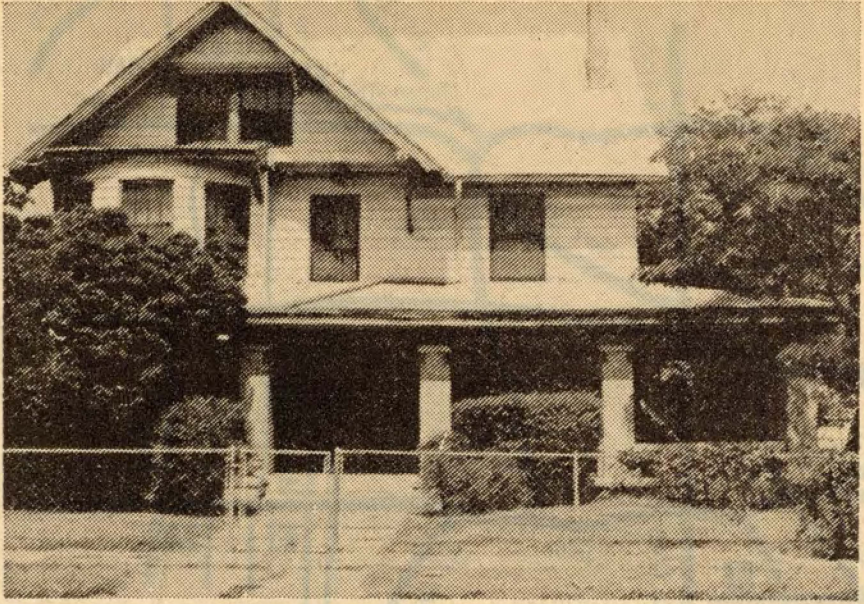

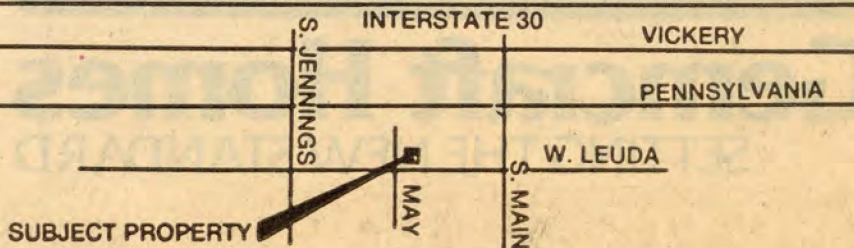
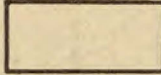
