



Mayor Art Miner and his family, wife Sharon and children Jarrel and Amanda, moved to Watauga in 1996 after retiring with 25 years of service with the U.S. Navy. They relocated to Watauga from Patuxent River Maryland where he was a Program Manager for Naval Air Systems Command. Having two small children, the outstanding school districts serving the community was the driving factor in choosing Watauga for their home. With his background in production management, Art found employment with various companies in the Metroplex starting as a Production Assistant with an electronics

company, Operations Manager in structural steel and finishing out his 2nd career as Plant Manager with a national recycling company.

On the home front, Art immediately immersed himself into the community coaching baseball for four years with NAYA, girls basketball with Upward and girls volleyball with the YMCA. Within a few years, Art began his venture into local city service. Mayor Hector Garcia appointed Art to his first city board, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board in 1998. Wanting to be more involved, Art was appointed to the Parks Development Corporation two years later where he has served as the president for 12 of those years. Art also served on the Veterans Advisory Board. Capp Smith Park, the Hector F. Garcia Recreation Center and the Veterans Memorial are but a few of the major accomplishments during his tenure.

After many years of urging from friends and others, Art decided to throw his hat into the political arena and run for mayor and

was sworn in this past May. Mayor Miner said, "I have an excellent City Council and an outstanding City Manager, and I look forward to great things for the City of Watauga." Art also serves as the President of the Economic Development Corporation.

TARRANT COUNTY ELECTIONS

These are exciting days in the Elections Administration Department of Tarrant County, with new things coming your way. Some changes we started rolling out last year, and as more are put in place, you will hopefully see they all feed into each other.

We started by adding electronic poll books to our check-in process; by doing this, we eliminated a bottleneck in the check-in process. So far, your feedback has been positive. Last month we took the next step and bought new voting machines.

Starting this November, you will vote in a Hybrid system: you will first come up to a touchscreen to make your choices, and when you are done, the machine will print out your choices on your ballot. You will then be able to review your ballot before you go to a separate machine, a scanner, to insert it and have it counted and deposited in the ballot box. From now on, every voter in Tarrant County will have a paper trail and will vote the same way, whether it's during Early Voting or on Election Day.

Our last change is yet to be approved by the Secretary of State. We applied for the Vote Centers program the day after we purchased the voting machines. If the SOS approves our application, you will be able to vote at any location in the county on election day.



I highly encourage you to visit our website and to find us on Facebook (@TarrantCountyElections) and Twitter (@tarrantelection). We are working very hard to make voting easier, more



convenient, and more accessible. But ultimately, we need you to cast your ballot to make it all worth it. Mark your calendars, Early Voting starts October 21 and Election Day is November 5.



Question of the Month

Question: Things you might not have known about Sam Houston...

Answer: Sam Houston's record of public service is long, all the more impressive since it was accomplished with minimal education. An abbreviated view of his life reveals that in 1818 he began studying law on his own in Nashville, Tennessee. After a few months, he opened a law office in Lebanon, Tennessee, and that same year was elected district attorney for the Nashville district. He was appointed adjutant general with the rank of colonel, and in 1821 he was elected to the rank of major general. Houston was seated in the United States Congress without opposition in 1823 and re-elected in 1825. Two years later, he became governor of Tennessee, and in 1829 Houston was granted citizenship into the Cherokee Nation and served as Indian Agent to the U.S. in Washington. In 1835, after moving to Texas, Houston was elected major general in the Texas army. He was a signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence from Mexico and commander-in chief of the Texas army. In 1836 Houston was elected president of the Republic of Texas and was re-elected in 1841. He also represented Texas in the U.S. Senate for fourteen years. Houston was also Governor of Texas. Whew! All this was accomplished in spite of the fact that Houston's only formal education was a few terms in neighborhood schools.





"Real people. Real Hope. Real Life."
These are the words seen by the thousands that drive by the sign at Cross City Church in Euless. More than just a slogan, this is the heart of the church. On any Sunday, you'll find a group of authentic, welcoming people who genuinely care about the community. From its launch in 1904, the church has cared for the people that live in the community and beyond. Many community-focused organizations have launched from its membership, including national non-profits that partner with apartment complexes and school districts. Among the most active in this community is 6 Stones. Started ten years ago through the leadership of Pastor John Meador, 6 Stones has been a

catalyst of hope. It has provided food, clothing, school supplies, and Christmas gifts for thousands in the community. And,

through Community-Powered Revitalization, 6 Stones volunteers from businesses, churches, cities, and other organizations have helped repair over 600 homes.

In recent years, the church has taken even more forward-thinking steps to become more accessible to people in and around Tarrant County while remaining rooted in Euless. Responding to the rapid growth in Northwest Tarrant County, the church launched a satellite campus at Byron Nelson High School in Trophy Club. Further, the church is embarking on its most ambitious project to date.

In June, Cross City voted to begin a major project that will transform the Euless Campus. The scope includes a new commons area for welcoming guests that will include a coffee shop and an indoor playscape for

kids. Also included is a new building for kids and students, as well as accessibility enhancements for senior adults. It's all part of the continuing effort to be a place where all are welcome.

edford Texas, located in Northeast Tarrant County, is a vibrant community and home to more than 49,000 residents. Nestled in the heart of the mid-cities, Bedford is just a few minutes away from the DFW International Airport, and about 13 miles northeast of downtown Fort Worth and 20 miles west of Dallas.


Bedford takes pride in offering the best quality of life for their residents. They offer a wide range of exciting community events throughout the year, creating lasting memories for years to come. Residents and visitors can enjoy Bedford's trademark, 3-day event, the Blues & BBQ Festival or one of the numerous parks located throughout the city.

The public library is a popular attraction for all ages, including Storytime for preschoolers and toddlers. Teen-focused opportunities include programs selected by their peers; the Teen Action Council, including online tutoring, math homework help, movies and gaming night, to mention a few. Adults can enjoy music, art and numerous other clubs offered throughout the year. Other special events, as well as having an expansive collection of print and digital materials can be enjoyed.

The Bedford Police Department employs 85 full-time officers, 55 full-time civilian employees and 48 volunteers in Police Service (VIPS). Their Mission Statement reads "The Bedford Police Department and it's members believe in the dignity and worth of all people. They are committed to: providing high quality community-oriented policing services with sensitivity; protecting constitutional rights; problem solving; teamwork; openness; planning for the future; and providing leadership to the police profession.


The Fire Department is fully paid with 66 sworn personnel. Equipped with an Emergency Operations Division, Swift Water Rescue Team, NEFDA Hazardous Materials Response Team, and Emergency Medical Services. Their Mission Statement reads "To save lives, meet the community's needs through service before self and to safeguard the quality of life for all."

Hurst-Euless-Bedford (HEB) School District is the primary school district serving the City of Bedford. With more than 22,834 students, HEB ISD is rich with diversity, which gives the district a distinctly international flavor. Students come from homes where more than 60 different native languages are spoken.

• Recently completed work on SH 26 includes the switch of motorists to the new northbound pavement on the east side of SH 26 from Church Street north to John McCain Road. The cross streets of Church Street and Hall-Johnson Road have also switched motorists to new pavement on the east side of SH 26.

• SH 26 construction activity on the east side of SH 26 continues with the construction of the

new northbound lanes between Centerpark Drive and Pleasant Run Creek, as well as installation of driveways, sidewalks, retaining walls and lighting foundations.



• Construction activity has begun in the center medians from Church Street north to John McCain Road to remove temporary pavement and construct median curbs and left-turn lanes. Project completion is estimated for Spring 2020.

• Recently completed work on FM 1938 includes the switch of motorists to the new southbound pavement at the north end of the project. Both the Fawkes Lane road tie-in and the Beam Road tie-in at FM 1938 have both been reopened. Other work recently completed includes retaining walls, driveways, and sidewalks on the north end. Additionally, the screen wall has been mostly installed with panels on the east side of FM 1938 near Lovegrass Lane.



- Over the next several weeks, the contractor will install the remaining irrigation and landscaping items and complete the striping and permanent lighting installation throughout the project limits. There are some remaining items on the screen wall on the south end of the project to complete as well.
- The FM 1938 project is estimated for substantial completion within a month.
