Rising To The Task

Just over a month ago, we gave our first COVID vaccines in Tarrant County. Since then, Public Health, JPS, Arlington, area hospitals and pharmacies have given well

We were originally told to focus on first responders and healthcare workers. We opened two sites, the Resource Connection and Esports Stadium Arlington. Hospitals also began to vaccinate their employees.


Within days, the Governor expanded the focus to include folks over 65 and those with health issues. This enlarged the pool to over 600,000 eligible individuals. Working with our private and public partners, we added additional mega sites.

We now have the ability to vaccinate close to 40,000 a week. Hopefully, in the near future we may double or even triple this number.

Everyone should register with our Public Health Department regardless of what category you fall into. Visit tarrantcounty.com/covidshot to register to get your vaccine. Then be patient, we will eventually get to everyone who wants a vaccine.

In anticipation of an increased vaccine supply, we are looking for a partner to oversee site selection and staff training at additional distribution sites in Tarrant and surrounding counties. These additional locations could be in the form of mega centers, neighborhood sites, mobile sites and/or drive-through centers. The partnership will also increase communication efforts to explain the importance of getting vaccinated.

Vaccinating our region in short order is a herculean task. This is not only true now, but especially as additional vaccine distribution sites come online. The



Tarrant County Medical Reserve Corp (MRC) is a network of medical and lay volunteers who are interested in assisting the community during times of emergency and other community needs.

Currently, volunteers are needed to assist in a variety of roles at vaccine sites located throughout Tarrant County. In addition, volunteers are needed to work in call centers to help answer questions and help register residents for the vaccine. Individuals can volunteer as their schedule permits. Volunteers must consent to and pass a criminal background check.

Critical Blood Supply Shortages



The first of the year is usually following the national safety a period of critical blood shortages because of the holidays or people getting sick during cold and flu season.

The rise in COVID-19 cases is negatively affecting our community blood drives with increased cancellations resulting in a larger shortage.

The daily demand for blood and blood products for patients requiring chronic transfusion, scheduled surgery, and cancer treatment is ever-increasing. The hospitals' ability to be prepared for emergencies is our immediate concern.

Additionally, those who have survived COVID-19 are needed to donate convalescent plasma or CCP. CCP saves lives of patients that may have no other options for survival. If you have already received the COVID-19 vaccination, you are not eligible to donate CCP, however, you are still able to donate blood.

It is safe to donate! The coronavirus does not pose any known risk to blood donors during the donation process or from attending blood drives. Along with

guidelines for their industry, Carter BloodCare has increased the frequency of cleaning beyond what is required. This includes sanitizing the donor beds and



surrounding workstations, donor screening areas, our refreshment areas, doorknobs, and the waiting area. Hand sanitizer is readily available.

The residents of **Tarrant County**

have felt the effects of COVID-19 physically, economically, and mentally. For many, just meeting the basic needs of their family has been a challenge.

During the pandemic, the ability for residents to make rent payments has become increasingly difficult, setting the stage for a high number of evictions. According to a U.S. Census Bureau Household Pulse Survey for the weeks of December 9 - 21, 2020, approximately 40% of Texans likely faced eviction or foreclosure in the next two months. This was up from approximately 35% the week prior. In Tarrant County alone, from April 1st through December 20th, there were 2,681 eviction cases filed.

In 2020, the federal government took action by issuing Federal Eviction Moratorium Orders preventing individuals and families from being evicted for nonpayment of rent. The current moratorium, issued by the Centers for Disease Control, temporarily halts residential evictions for non-payment of rent until March 31, 2021. The moratorium is only temporary and

> In April 2020, Congress passed the CARES Act, providing funding to support COVID-19 related relief and recovery efforts; Tarrant County received \$209 million. Of those funds, the Tarrant County Commissioners Court allocated \$10 million for rental assistance for qualified individuals living in Tarrant County. The city of Fort Worth also received funding from the CARES Act and allocated a portion for rental assistance for Fort Worth residents.

> Tarrant County's rental assistance program provided payments for overdue rent to those directly impacted by the pandemic. As of January 26, 2021, approximately \$5,491,753.65 in assistance has been provided to 1,447 households. In addition, through agreements with local non-governmental agencies, \$98,433.66 was provided for rental assistance. Tarrant County's CARES Act rental assistance program is currently closed for new applications, however, using funding from the December 2020 stimulus bill, the county will begin a new program for rent and utility assistance in the Spring.

Census Update



Census 2020 In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, Tarrant County successfully executed an awareness campaign to support and promote participation in the once-perdecade US Census enumeration efforts. The county's census awareness efforts were housed in the County Administrator's Office and ranged from engaging com-

munity stakeholders, such as municipalities and religious institutions, in promotional campaigns to execute targeted social media advertisement campaigns.


COVID-19 placed significant constraints on the County's ability to conduct in-person outreach and, as a result, a strong emphasis was placed on virtual engagement strategies. Despite facing unprecedented challenges stemming from a global public health crisis, Tarrant County was able to increase census self-response rates from 66.8 percent in 2010 to 68.9 percent in 2020.

According to the US Census Bureau, agency staff is currently completing the process of tabulating and verifying data collection results. Data from the 2020 US Census enumeration is estimated to be made available to state and local stakeholders in the summer of

2021. This data will provide valuable information to guide redistricting and apportionment processes. Additionally, the data will enable the county to more efficiently and effectively target services and resources.
