

## Stroke among Tarrant County Adults


A stroke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked by a clot or bursts, causing brain cells to die



Figure 1. Stroke mortality among Tarrant County residents, 2013-2022\* 52.2




*Figure 3. Stroke mortality among Tarrant County residents by selected demographics, 2022*\*






*Figure 2. Stroke mortality among selected geographic areas, 2022*\*
