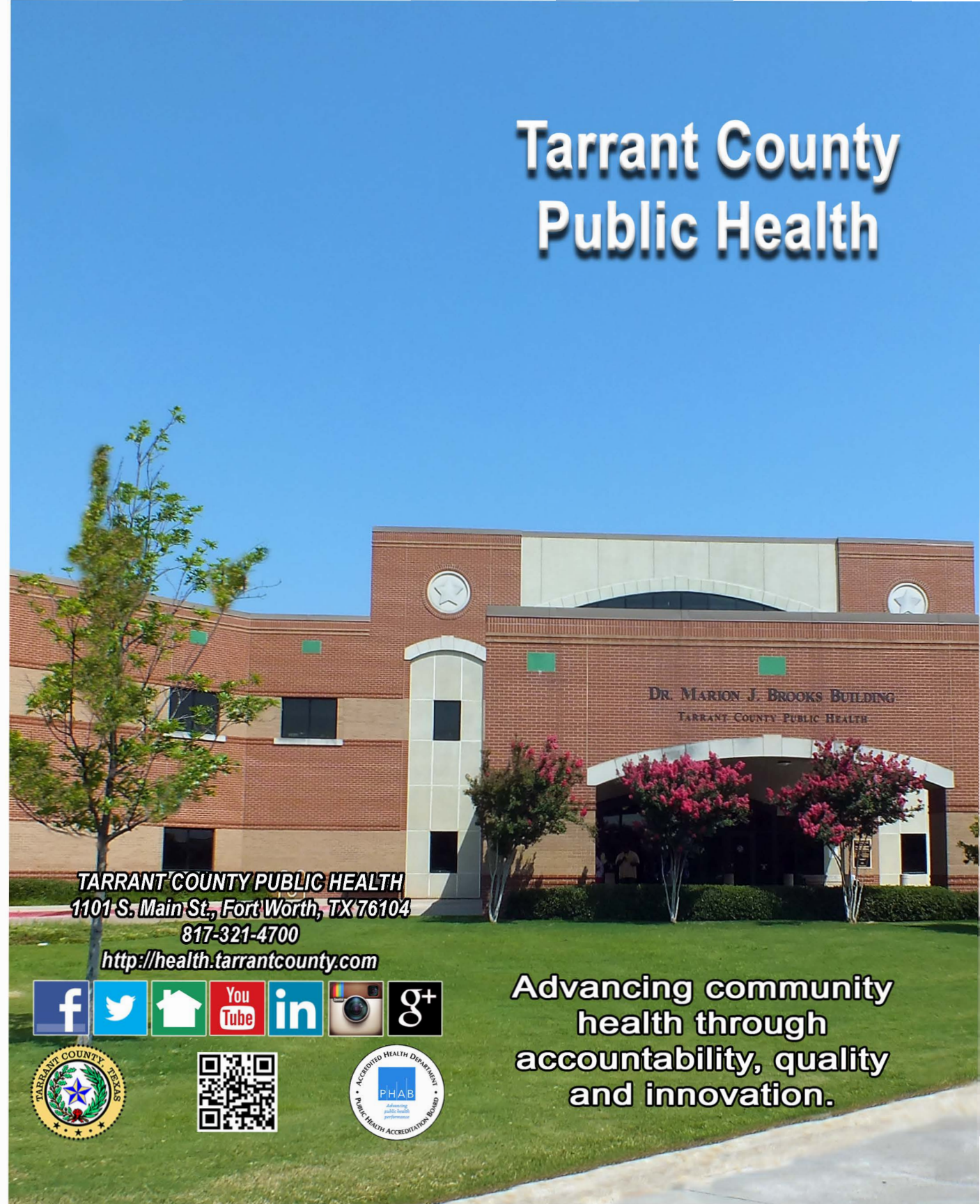

The mission of Tarrant County Public Health (TCPH) is to advance the community's health through accountability, quality and innovation. As part of Tarrant County government, TCPH has a dedicated staff of more than 400. Services are overseen by a director and a medical director who also serves as the county's Local Health Authority. The department's wide scope of operations includes:

Clinical Services



Adult Health Services- treats sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and provides confidential education, testing and counseling for HIV and STDs, and PrEP services.

Breast, Cervical Cancer Control Program- provides breast exams and Pap smears, assistance with mammograms and case management and referrals for underinsured and uninsured women.

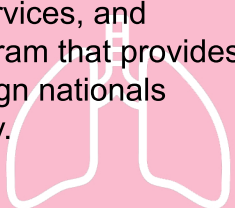
Immunizations - provides a variety of vaccines for children and adults.



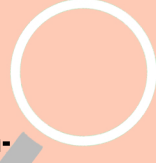
Preventive Medicine Clinic- offers primary medical care and case management for adults living with HIV.

Travel Health Services- offers immunizations and health information to people traveling abroad, including international vaccination "yellow" cards.

Tuberculosis Elimination- provides screening and treatment for tuberculosis, responds to TB occurrences, conducts ongoing educational outreach services, and operates a refugee program that provides health screening to foreign nationals settling in Tarrant County.

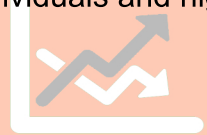


Disease Control and Prevention



Epidemiology & Health Information-

- continuously monitors the community's health status
- responds to dangerous infectious disease occurrences, including environmental and occupational illnesses
- maintains health statistics and databases of specific diseases
- serves as a resource for health providers and organizations
- mobilizes local, state and federal resources, when necessary, to meet the health needs of individuals and high-risk groups

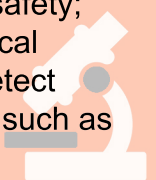


Health Informatics-

- maintains multiple surveillance systems that collect data from hospitals and clinics across North Texas
- structures health data in ways that facilitate decision-making

North Texas Regional Laboratory-

- routinely tests water, milk and dairy products to ensure consumer safety;
- performs bacterial and chemical analysis of drinking water to detect harmful metals and organisms such as lead and coliform bacteria;
- participates in surveillance for infectious diseases for the north Texas region.



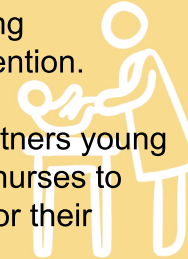
Family Health Services

Prematurity Prevention- provides case management for pregnant women at-risk for a repeat preterm birth.



Chronic Disease Prevention- provides education and screenings that help prevent disease and reduce the effects of asthma, diabetes, heart disease, falls, hypertension, obesity, and tobacco use.

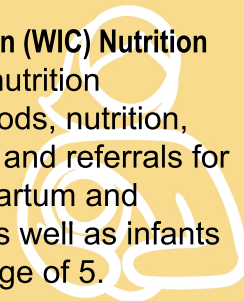
Mortality Reviews- community teams charged with identifying trends in infant and child deaths and making recommendations for prevention.



Nurse-Family Partnership- partners young mothers with experienced nurses to improve health outcomes for their children.

Perinatal Hepatitis B Program- provides case management for infants born to mothers who test positive for Hepatitis B during pregnancy.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Nutrition Program- WIC provides nutrition assessments, healthy foods, nutrition, breastfeeding education and referrals for eligible pregnant, post-partum and breastfeeding women, as well as infants and children under the age of 5.



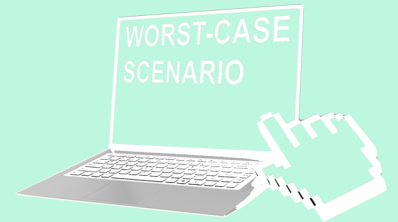
Health Protection and Response



Environmental Health-

- provides food handler training and permits
- inspects food service establishments and public swimming pools
- performs vector control
- monitors sewage disposal, water supply systems and stormwater runoff
- provides community education and outreach programs

Public Health Preparedness- partners with community organizations, municipalities, health care providers and businesses to plan and implement response and recovery measures in the event of a public health threat or emergency.
