April 18 th Meeting Recap (1:32)	Presented by Tanisha Stanford Spoken Languages 125 languages spoken throughout Tarrant County 16.3% foreign born population in TC Over 200,000 TC residents with LEP Ages & Abilities We must consider the 11.6% of TC that are elders that may not be technologically savy to receive information disseminated through digital platforms 10% of TC that possess disability that could potentially affect their ability to communicate and receive important information Literacy & Health Literacy Literacy: the ability to read, write, speak and listen in a way that allows us to communicate effectively and navigate the environments around us Health Literacy: the degree to which an individual has the capacity to obtain, process and understand basic health information needed to make appropriate health decisions In Ft. Worth ISD, less than 50% of students between 3rd and 8th grade are meeting the literacy standards of the STAAR test as of 2019 One in five adults in TC cannot read well enough to succeed at a 4th grade level.
